

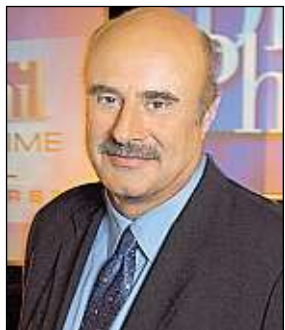

Honoring a friend

Malaak Compton-Rock, in Saks in Hackensack on Wednesday for a "Tea and Talk for Awareness Shopping Benefit" for the Triple Negative Breast Cancer Foundation, said she got involved with the cause to honor the dying wish of a friend, Nancy Block-Zenna.

"My 5-year-old daughter, Lola, went to camp with her 5-year-old daughter," said Compton-Rock, who, with husband Chris Rock, threw the inaugural fund-raising event at their Alpine home in June 2007. "It was just a two-hour cocktail event, and we raised \$270,000, which really got the organization going."

Compton-Rock, who's slated to be a judge on Oprah Winfrey's new ABC prime-time series, "Oprah's Big Give," said the TNBC Foundation's goal is to fund research and raise awareness of this recently recognized form of breast cancer, which occurs most often in African-American and younger women.

Block-Zenna, who lived in Cresskill, died at age 37 in August — two months after the fund-raiser at Compton-Rock's home. "When she was at the event, she

was very, very frail, but she wanted to be there," Compton-Rock said. "I'm happy to say that when she made her transition, she knew how much money we raised, and she knew there was going to be a symposium. So, she got her wish."

Spears released

Britney Spears was quietly released Wednesday from a hospital where she had been undergoing a psychiatric evaluation, a police official said.

"It occurred without any law enforcement intervention, and for the public that's a good thing," said Capt. Sharyn Buck, commander of the North Hollywood police station, which covers the area of Spears' home.

DUI sentence

Rebecca De Mornay must serve three years' probation after a no-contest plea was entered this week on her behalf to a misdemeanor drunken driving charge.

Los Angeles Superior Court Judge H. Chester Horn also ordered the 48-year-old actress to complete a three-month program for DUI offenders and pay \$350 plus unspecified penalties.

Dr. Phil loses round

A judge refused to dismiss a defamation suit this week against CBS and television psychologist "Dr. Phil" **McGraw** brought by two brothers who were questioned in the disappearance of Natalee Holloway.

William Cremer, the lead attorney for Surinamese brothers Deepak and Satish Kalpo, praised the decision by Superior Court Judge Edward A. Ferns.

Winehouse questioned

British singer **Amy Winehouse** has been questioned about a video that allegedly showed her smoking crack cocaine, police said Wednesday.

No charges were filed, and an investigation is continuing, police said.

Last month, The Sun tabloid ran still images from a video that showed the jazz-pop diva inhaling fumes from a small pipe.

Sinatra tribute

Ten years after his death, several Time Warner entities are banding together to hold a monthlong tribute to **Frank Sinatra** in May.

Warner Music Group's Reprise Records will release "Nothing but the Best," a single disc that will feature 22 songs remixed and remastered from the original master tapes, as well as a previously unreleased arrangement of "Body and Soul."

The compilation will be available at traditional retail, as well as at FrankSinatra.com and at post offices.

Festival headliners

Metallica and **Pearl Jam** will headline the 2008 Bonnaroo Arts and Music Festival, concert organizers announced Wednesday.

The seventh annual festival will be held June 13-15 on a 700-acre farm in Manchester, Tenn.

Tickets to the festival go on sale Feb. 16.

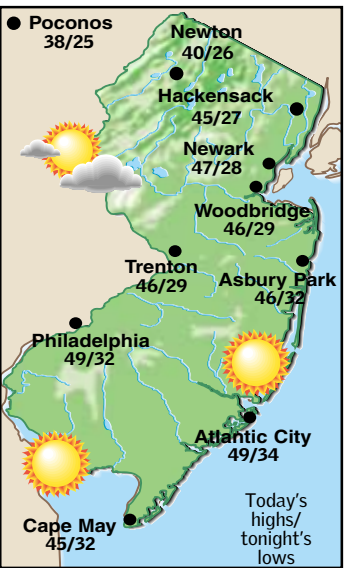

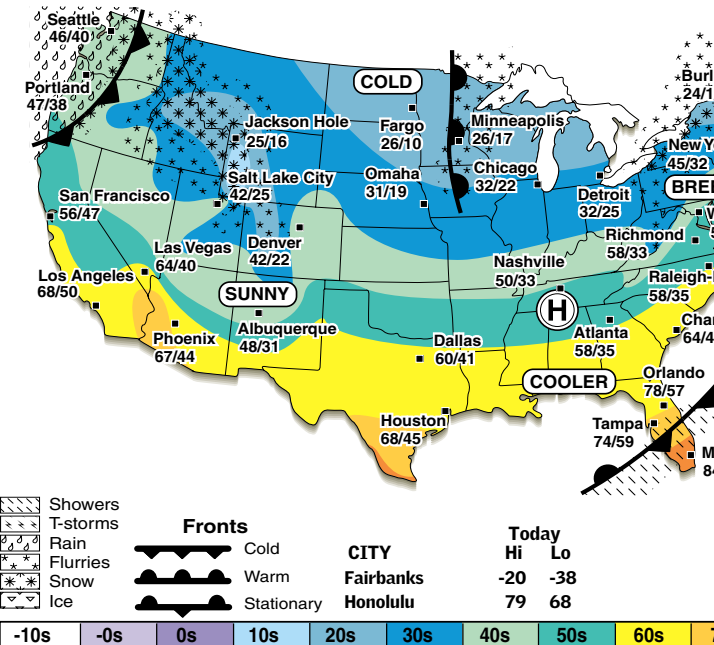
